# Paul writes in the first chapter of Philippians,

"Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that what has happened to me has actually advanced the gospel," (CSB).

As he wrote those words from a prison cell where he spent most of his hours chained to Roman guards, it would appear that he is simply looking at his situation through rose-coloured glasses. I think it's easy to dismiss these words as the naivete of an optimist who needed to convince himself that this suffering was worth it.

But to Paul it was. He wholeheartedly believed that God didn't owe him anything because He had already been given everything by God through Christ. It freed him from the need for his life to be successful. Instead, all he pursued was faithfulness. And God can use the faithfulness of His saints to advance the gospel from a pulpit or a prison cell. For Paul, the glory and advancement were at the centre of his life and produced a deep, always-present joy.

Might his example be something we as a church aspire to in 2018. In the last year, God has challenged our comforts, our expectations and our faith, in order that we give ourselves to the faithful, joy-filled advancement of the gospel. I hope you've seen it. I know I have. I have seen the gospel advance into areas of my life that I never thought needed it. I have seen the gospel advance into areas of our church to confront long-held assumptions. I have seen the gospel advance into our communities to bring salvation.

It has been hard. But it's been worth it. And it will continue to be. God's not asking us to be successful. He's asking us to be faithful.

As we consider carefully the next stages of implementing the vision we believe God has given us, we do so with a hopeful expectation that whatever

happens will result in the advancement of the gospel. I invite you to continue to journey in this direction, in order that our freedom may abound and our joy may increase.

We value purposeful and expectant prayer. This means that we will seek out God's face and favour with an expectancy that He will answer us.


# AVERAGE WEEKEND ATTENDANCE

# Donors

Every week, children are being encouraged and challenged with the gospel of Jesus Christ during weekend services. Some highlights from children's ministry in Salmon Arm in 2017:

It was a real blessing to hear children singing praises to our Lord this past Christmas as the children's choir truly ministered to our hearts.

We have a number of outreach events that we do each year for children. In fall, winter, and spring, in six-week blocks, we meet every Wednesday for the After School Kids Club. We have seen children respond to the gospel to the glory of God while enjoying games, activities, crafts, and story time.

Our summer outreach consisted of Soccer Camps in four communities across the Shuswap. Many children heard the good news and it was a real encouragement to see the church coming together and using their gifts to serve Him.

Children are also being encouraged to see the importance of serving in our church and being a significant part of it. It brings great joy to see some of our most recent children's ministry "graduates" serving the Lord here at SCC Salmon Arm in a variety of different ministries.
