During a very special Huddle (Chapel for Middle School), our 6th-8th grade students shared personal stories of how they have seen God's faithfulness through the generations in their families. They interviewed family members about their immigration stories and learned testimonies of God's provision in their lives. Several students bravely presented these stories before the entire school.

One student, shared that her Dad's immigration story reminds her "that even through the toughest times, we can overcome anything through God's faithfulness. God was able to help my dad cross to a different country and kept him safe throughout the journey." Another student spoke about his Grandma's journey from the Philippines to the U.S. and how he learned "that God uses hardships and immigration for people to find Him." A third student shared her family member's story of being accepted into USC: "Trusting in the Lord's guidance and seeing scholarships and support come through is truly a testament to His provision. My family's story is so inspiring and reminds me of the incredible ways that God works in our lives."

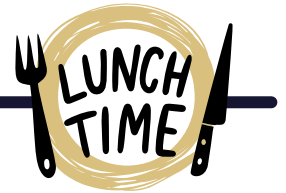
3RD GRADE AND BLACK HISTORY MONTH
